It is pleasing that most students over 12 years old have received their first vaccine and that nearly all staff are fully vaccinated. It is also wonderful that the holiday break has been used to upgrade our video and sound technology in every classroom as well as increase the bandwidth. We should feel proud of this achievement as well as our resilience. We know that this year will have its challenges but can feel very confident that we have demonstrated the capacity to accept challenges and overcome obstacles.

Mrs. Fenny Sukanto, General Manager of Sekolah Ciputra, said we received an allocation of 1000 doses which were


used for Sekolah Ciputra and Sekolah Citra Berkas. There were 400 vaccines also available for students from other schools around Citraland.





Welcome to the 2021-2022 Academic Year

Dear High School Parents,

It is with great pleasure and a wonderful sense of anticipation that I welcome you all to the High School of Sekolah Ciputra (SC) and to the 2021-2022 school year. I trust that you have had an opportunity to rest, relax and recuperate – but most importantly, to enjoy the unstructured time to be with family and friends and do the things you wanted to do over the summer break.

I wish to extend a special word of welcome to all of our new families who have joined us. We look forward to forging strong and lasting relationships with you, in support of your child's life-journey at SC. To our existing families, we look forward to welcoming you back to a new chapter in the lives of your children – one in which we trust that they will continue to grow: as communicators, as self-motivated learners, as critical thinkers, and as positive contributors to SC and the wider community.

There is no doubt that the High School provides an excellent academic programme (virtual or otherwise) but, by itself and without the commitment of each individual student, success will be limited. We need every student to own their responsibility for their learning and this process begins in the quietness of your home when you discuss these issues and help your children to set realistic goals for the year ahead. We appeal to you to ensure that you allocate some good, quality time to this process over the next few weeks. Encourage your child to write out exactly what they intend to achieve and keep these goals somewhere where they are visible and can be regularly referred to throughout the year.

Goals that are clearly out of reach for a particular child can only lead to heartbreak and disillusionment when they are not achieved and goals that are not ambitious enough will merely set the child up to 'cruise.' Good goals ensure significant, incremental change throughout the year. The setting and achievement of meaningful goals is a life habit that can only benefit your child in their future lives! The goal-setting process that you begin at home will be reinforced and supported at Sekolah Ciputra.

While academic success is at the heart of our school vision, we are equally committed to the education of the whole child by providing a full range of activities that build character, foster dedication to community service, and create future leaders. We pride ourselves on being a global school and one which is committed to building a strong learning triangle: parent-teacher-student. The key is regular and effective dialogue between these three parties in order for each student to best utilise the wide array of opportunities that are made available throughout the academic year.

We must continue to work closely together to quickly address issues of student disengagement and/or a declining aptitude for learning, especially as we begin this academic year with online learning. ESSAY COMPETITION

In early 2021, I discovered the John Locke Institute's essay competition. It works as such: the committee provides a range of topics, and encased in each is three challenging debatable prompts. Students are required to select only one prompt and respond to it in an essay no longer than 2000 words. The essays are then to be judged and shortlisted, from which winners will be selected.

Out of all the prompts, I was particularly drawn to a theology question which asked, 'Is Christianity* a religion of peace?' As a Catholic, I had never really questioned peace in my faith. But just by reading the prompt my perspective towards Christianity had shifted. At this point I began wondering about scenarios in the Bible that contradicted Christian dogma, such as why the Ten Commandments doesn't allow killing, yet God commanded killing in several instances.

The debate on this issue was no less than controversial, and it was extremely complex considering the various elements one had to consider to produce an argument. After 16 years of believing, I was determined to prove that the religion I had held onto for so long was peaceful—at least, its foundational values were. I attempted to prove that Christianity was a religion of peace by looking at the Old Testament, the New Testament, actions that have been claimed to be of divine will, and examples of Christian-inspired peace in the modern world. That way, I covered a large scope of the elements that proved Christianity's peaceful nature.

On July 15, 2021, I received an email from the John Locke Institute stating that my essay was among the 50 theology essays that had been shortlisted. I was grateful that my research, writing, and proofreading had led up to this achievement. An immense thank you to the teachers that guided me through writing this essay. The prize winners will be announced in September 2021.

*Christianity refers to beliefs derived from Jesus Christ, centered upon the Bible, and acknowledged by Roman, Eastern Orthodox, and Protestant Churches [Stefon].
