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WIDA COMES TO SEKOLAH CIPUTRA

In Term 2 we will be introducing the WIDA MODEL Paper to PYP B - PYP 2 students in order to provide opportunities for students to demonstrate their English language proficiency in the four language domains: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Each of these domains is assessed separately. All four domain tests are delivered face-to-face between Test Administrators and students. The Speaking and Listening tests are individually administered while the Reading and Writing tests may be administered individually or in small groups.

We are very excited to have this form of standardised and diagnostic testing available to our EY and lower Elementary students as it will now provide a continuum longitudinal data collection of our students' English language development. This tool will also allow us to target students who require additional support in their English language acquisition.

PYP PE NEWS

This year, the PYP PE department has introduced a 3X3 basketball competition to help students improve their physical fitness, teamwork, and sportsmanship. We also encourage the students to show and do their best in all PE activities and programs.

In this term, we're also working collaboratively with PYP 2 students to explore different places and cultures. We're excited to have Mr. Stefan Bergh, the Sports and Physical Education Coordinator, share his knowledge of sports and traditional games from his country. Our students are really enthusiastic about this initiative and are actively participating. We're also getting our PYP Elite Basketball and Soccer teams ready to compete in future competition which is adding to the excitement. Finally, we are in the middle of preparing a GIRLS ONLY Training Camp Week to develop our female sports teams for the coming years. This will happen for Basketball, Volleyball and Soccer. We are seriously working towards ensuring our students live the learner attribute of being balanced by offering greater opportunities to both girls and boys.

In summary, our goal is to promote physical fitness, teamwork, and cultural awareness among our students through sports and cultural exchange. We have enjoyed our events this term and look forward to more great PRE and sport in Term 2!

Competition Details:

Theme: Your product must be related to social and/or environmental responsibility.

Product Type: Your entry should be a physical product accompanied by a brief description of your business in the form of a single-page business plan.

Submission Deadline: Please submit your prototypes and a printout of your business plan to Mr. Evan in Room D312 no later than November 2nd.

Once your prototypes are submitted, they will be displayed in the Library Resource Center (LRC) during Global Entrepreneurship Week (November 13th-19). This provides a fantastic opportunity for you to showcase your work to the school community and beyond.

Awards:

First Place: Certificate of Commendation from Sekolah Ciputra and 1,000,000 IDR to fund your project.

Second Place: Certificate of Commendation.

Judging Criteria:

Our panel of teacher judges will evaluate your prototypes based on the ${}^{\rm I}$ following three criteria, each with a maximum score of ten:

Professional Design: How well your product is designed and presented. **Embodiment of Theme**: The extent to which your product aligns with the social and/or environmental responsibility theme.

Business Plan Strategy and Profitability: Your ability to articulate a sound business strategy and potential profitability for your product.

This competition not only provides you with an opportunity to put your creative ideas into action but also offers a platform to make a positive impact on our society and the environment. We encourage you to think innovatively and consider how your product can contribute to a better world.

HIGH SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

As we come to the end of Term 1 in the High School, we wanted to inform you of several things that have taken place, as well as prepare you for things to look forward to in Term 2. The end of term is always a busy time for students, as they have to complete final summative assessments in a number of subjects in order for teachers to be able to provide the best feedback possible on students' progress reports. Term 1 progress reports will be generated on ManageBac this year, and will be available for all students and parents on Wednesday, October 4th. This will be followed up with our first Parent Teacher Conferences on Wednesday, October 11th, from 14:00-16:00. More information regarding these will be sent out soon.

All schools in Indonesia have to sit the national assessment (ANBK, Asesmen Nasional Berbasis Komputer) which happens in between August-October. This assessment is intended to assess the level of literacy and numeracy within a school. An addition to that, there is a survey about the school environment and programs. The assessment is for randomly selected students from Grade 5, 9, and 11. Grade 11 students completed the assessment on the 28th and 29th of August. Grade 8 will take their assessment on the 18th and 19th of September. Grade 5 will take their assessment between 23rd-26th of October. We would like to thank parents and students for their continual support on this matter. We hope all the results will continue to show positive evidence of our school's level in literacy and numeracy.

We will finish Term 1 with our annual Camp Trip, which is a highlight for many students, past and present. In order to minimize disruption for the 12th grade students' exam preparation, the decision was made to not have them go on camp. Instead, they will stay at school next week working with subject teachers to improve their knowledge and skills in a variety of subjects, as well as use the time to work on other requirements from the IBDP. Grade 11 students will leave on Tuesday for their camp in Bali, staying for 4 days and 3 nights. Grades 7-10 will leave on Wednesday for their camps in various locations across Java. Students who did not join the camp will come to school to participate in activities related to Creativity, Action and Service.

It has been a busy month for our sports teams as well. Our Boys' and Girls' Basketball Teams followed up the Senior DBL Tournament by competing in the Friendsters' Tournament at Cita Hati West. The Girls' Team finished as champions, while the Boys' Team finished in 2nd place. Congratulations to both teams! Our Football Teams have also begun their seasons, with the Junior Boys' playing a match against SES, and both of our Senior Boys' and Girls' Football Teams playing matches against SES and SIS. The Senior Boys' and Girls' Teams will finish the month by competing in a tournament, hosted by SIS.
