# From the Executive Principal

Welcome to our end of term 2 (and therefore semester 1) newsletter. It is wonderful to have the opportunity to reflect upon the many achievements in our school. As Executive Principal I want to focus on three such achievements that affect the entire school.

Firstly, I am delighted with the way that the structure and organisation of sport within the school has improved. We now have many more sports teams competing at many different levels. There is far more coaching and with the advent of volleyball in the school a wider range of sports. We have awarded sports scholarships for the following year and are looking to build a culture of commitment, where our school teams are well turned out, well prepared, competitive yet at the same time demonstrate personal integrity as stated in our school vision. We want teams from other schools to know that when they play a Sekolah Ciputra team they will face a committed, team that will provide them with a challenging game. They will play hard, and they will play fair. This is a beginning and I look forward to even more improvement, particularly in terms of participation in girls' sports.

The second area is that of strategic planning. Throughout the first term we have conducted a series of consultations with the Board, parents, students and staff. From this the school has been able to divide input under the headings of our core priorities and draft a plan that begins in 2024/2025-till the end of 2026/2027. This will lead us nicely into our next combined WASC/IBO visit. The next step is for our draft plan to be approved by the board and then actioned in our 2024/2025 annual plan.

Lastly thank you to everyone who was associated with our WASC mid cycle review. This was very gratifying for the school. The visiting team agreed with our conclusions but also added a long list of commendations. These are:

- 1- The school has developed various pathways for students including but not limited to: bi-lingual diplomas, high levels of academic mother-tongue literacy, and college admission nationally and internationally. This had led to increasing student achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcomes in all students.
- 2- The school as an IB Continuum school has focused on ATLs in connecting all three programs. Intentional emphasis is placed on teaching ATLs at every grade level in every course/class. The Visiting Committee found ample evidence of mature student self-agency being developed across the three programs which leads to high achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcomes in all students.

- 3- Engaged student learners and quality inquiry education was prevalent in all sight observations which leads to increasing student achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcomes in all students.
- 4- School commitment to ongoing professional development to all faculty and staff and to the support of regional education through Sekolah Ciputra staff, faculty, and leaders. This not only strengthens local partnerships and sense of community value by all parties but grows faculty leaders to the benefit of Sekolah Ciputra learners in increasing student achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcomes in all students.
- 5- School's commitment to the ongoing understanding and development of an authentic "IB Learning Continuum" school in every aspect to increase student achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcomes in all students.
- 6- School's governance board and Head of School and their strong and healthy relationship built on high trust and mutual alignment on Sekolah Ciputra's strategic goals to increase student achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcome in all students.
- 7- The school's "buy-in" to the WASC protocols and processes as an instrument to drive school improvement. The follow-up on the original Visiting Committee Report as a "first-term" WASC school was impressive and thorough. The school has also leveraged their WASC accreditation to improve college admission results and college and university attractiveness to their students as well as using it to attract new students and families to the school and using it to improve teacher recruitment attractiveness. These all lead to increased student achievement and the accomplishment of the school-wide learner outcomes in all students.

These are all wonderful things for the visiting team to commend us for but the one that is most satisfying is number 3, which celebrates the high quality of teaching and engagement in the school. It is lovely that the visiting teams saw this in every one of the many classes that they visited. It is also wonderful that the visits were unannounced, so staff did not know who would and who would not be visited. As Executive Principal this commendation was a very welcome early Christmas present!

The students have been busy working through their Units of Inquiry and we experienced two amazing assemblies from PYP 5 & 6 where we were shown all the learning that had taken place. We also enjoyed single subject assemblies and special celebrations like Bulan Bahasa

We have been really trying to provide the students with different opportunities this year in the areas of mathematics, science and computational thinking so we have been very excited to be able to open the JISMO and World Scholars Cup to everyone. We had many students reach impressive levels in these competitions and we are very excited to announce that in one age level our school came third in the JISMO competition which is a first - so that is a wonderful accomplishment. We also had really pleasing results in the BEBRAS Computational thinking competition recently held. Our students achieved above the Indonesian norm which is something we should be very proud of given that this is a new initiative in the PYP section. Providing our students with opportunities to experience different examination conditions certainly allows them to gain insight into how they can transfer their conceptual understanding of topics and how they can apply them to real life situations.

In keeping with our belief that our students should be provided a balanced, rounded and holistic school experience: we have been working hard at developing our newly initiated representative sports programme. Our Boys Elite Basketball and Soccer teams have competed in a number of tournaments this term and each time they play they grow in confidence and skill. We are also very proud of the sportsmanship they display in victory and defeat. Our attempts at growing the girls sports programme has borne some fruit in the inclusion of a girls basketball ECA, from which we hope to develop an elite Girls Basketball team in the 24/25 academic year. We live in hope that we will gain more female soccer players in the future to start an ECA which will lead to an ELite team.

Whilst our coffee mornings have been light on numbers the topics have been varied and the workshop leaders have created engaging and informative sessions for those parents who have attended. We will reduce the number of coffee mornings next semester to hopefully boost numbers.

We have ended the semester with our 'Page to Stage' Literacy and Arts week and this has been an absolute success. The students have really embraced all the activities and have shone their artistics lights so brightly. We started with a lively and fun assembly and enjoyed buddy reading, guest readers, script writing and performance, illustration and art creations and for the PYP 4-6 we enjoyed a webinar with four wonderful artists from across the globe. This semester has been full of learning, sports and the arts as well as 21st century skills like computational thinking. We have truly enjoyed a balanced and fun term.

We look forward to the second half of the year so see you all in January and have a wonderful holiday


#### **HIGH SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS**

As we come to the end of the 1st semester it is a perfect time to reflect on what has taken place, while also looking ahead to what is coming next semester. It has been a very successful semester for our school and school community! The transition to a trimester system in the Extra Curricular Activities (ECA's) has gone smoothly, as we started the 2nd trimester a few weeks ago. The Athletics Programme in the school has continued to blossom, with our new Boys' and Girls' Volleyball Teams competing in the PASS Tournament at SIS, as well as our Boys' Team traveling to compete in a tournament at Bali Island School December 8-10. This is a very exciting development, as it will be the first school sports team to travel for a competition outside of Surabaya! We hope it will encourage others to consider competing in events even further afield, as we have been invited to international competitions around the region this school year.

Over the past few weeks students in Grades 7-9 completed their final summative tasks [FST's] and students in Grades 10-11 completed their semester exams. These are all important for our students as we help them to better prepare for their IBDP exams at the end of 12th grade. Our 12th grade students have been submitting their final drafts for their Extended Essays and Internal Assessments in their subjects as they move closer to their Mock Exams and final IBDP exams next semester. It is a busy and stressful time for everyone, and it is important for students to not try to cram it all in at the last minute, but instead put smaller amounts of time (20 minutes per subject per day, for example) into their study and work over a longer period of time in order to improve their chances of success.

Our monthly High School Coffee Afternoons have been a huge success this semester, and we appreciate all of the parents that have taken the time out of their busy schedules in order to come meet with us to learn more about what is happening in the high school and provide helpful feedback to us. If you have not joined these sessions, please pay attention to the school events' calendar on the website, or communicate with the Parent Support Group (PSG) so you are aware of the dates and topics to be discussed each month. We have also greatly appreciated the Grade 9-12 parents that attended the University Information sessions led by our University Counselors, Ms. Ria and Ms. Thressye. # ECO SCHOOL COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES





The Eco School committee is designed to support the goals of the Eco School Programme and to help the Sekolah Ciputra environment be the best it can be by helping the students and staff to learn ways in which they can enjoy a clean environment. The members of the Eco School Committee are working together to accomplish this goal. We have developed three Action Plans which we are working on to promote more sustainable behaviour. The Food Group have developed posters promoting healthy eating choices which will be posted in the canteen; they are also encouraging the students not to waste food. With this, the Sekolah Ciputra members are expected to do this too. In my perspective, adding attractive posters could promote it well too. It's important for our whole community to know what we are doing so our activities have been promoted by the Communication team. The communication team has already posted lots of videos on TikTok and Instagram. We want you to know what we are doing! The communication team has already created an article that provides information about the Eco School Programme community. With this, it helps to promote why the Eco School Programme is important since it's not yet familiar to all students and parents. The energy team has already tried their best to promote why saving energy is important and are running a fun competition around creating a poster to remind people to 'Turn Off' the lights, Acs and computers when leaving the room. Not only are students involved, but there is also the parent support group - the Eco Warriors who support the committee in their work to create a great environment for Sekolah Ciputra.

### **WORKING BEE**

The last group that is working on an Action Plan is the Waste Committee and on Saturday, 2nd December, the Eco School Committee participated in an event centered on fulfilling some key goals on the Waste Action Plans around recycling solutions. Students were divided into five groups with each group allocated a major task. Four of the tasks came directly from the Waste Action Plan designed as part of the Eco School Programme.

One activity was part of the Service Learning activity initiated by STUCO and the PS where the Eco school Committee were involved in creating plant pots by recycling plastic bottles. This activity was guided by our Design Teacher Mr Adam in the Design workshop. The students were able to use the many kinds of tools in the workshop to create plastic planter pots for an aged home. The students cut out the recycled plastic bottle according to the instructions given by the teachers. With this activity, students were not only saving the environment but they could also express their ideas to decorate the pot; they could paint it too. They created planters that looked great and will perform the task of growing plants in them.

Another group built Ecobrick stations from wooden fruit crates. These will be distributed around the school so that students can make eco-bricks whenever they want during break time. At the same time, another group was making eco-bricks using plastic bottles and filling them with non-recyclable plastics such as food packaging, soap packaging, detergent packaging, and all kinds of plastic packaging that we can't easily recycle. The students filled the bottles tightly with this material, compacting it tightly to successfully make the eco-bricks.

Another activity was centered around painting and preparing Paper Recycling boxes for classrooms. Students diligently worked alongside Mr. Zach and Mr Mal on this task, displaying their enjoyment and creativity. The aim is to encourage more recycling of paper within the school environment.

While all this was happening, some of the students were working hard in the High School LRC with Ms Tiffany creating our Sekolah Ciputra Eco School Eco Code. This turned out to be an amazing Acrostic poem, which we all agreed expressed exactly how we all felt about our work.

In addition, this same group of students led by a Grade 7 student, Kevin, started to develop a Sekolah Ciputra Eco Calendar Which they will continue to work on this semester. It was so great to see over 50 students, teachers, and parents actively involved in the event. The parents not only worked side-by-side with our students and teachers but they also supplied us all with great snacks. We couldn't have done it without our PSG Eco Warrior parents. It was an amazing team effort and something we should all be very proud of.


